Rex Ridgeway, Former Interim CBOC Chair, SFUSD

In August 2018 the District's CBOC members reached their term limits. As a result of the efforts of a group of citizens, including Rex Ridgeway, a new CBOC was appointed in May 2021 by the District. Rex served as Vice Chair and Interim Chair on the

new CBOC. He provided leadership to challenge illegal bond expenditures successfully, changed the process for appointing CBOC members, drafted bylaws to make the CBOC independent, submitted to the public the first annual report since 2019, reviewed prior audits for fiscal years 2020 and 2021, and supported revitalizing the CBOC as an effective bond oversight committee.



Greg Chopskie

Attorney Greg Chopskie counseled and represented executives in global, research-based biopharmaceutical Fortune 500 multinationals. Managed teams of litigators. Is a former Partner at a major San Francisco law firm. Practice focused on Patents,

Copyrights, Trademarks, Intellectual Property. Now, in private practice, Mr. Chopskie spends an unusual amount of his time on matters concerning the San Francisco Unified School District (SFUSD), including, but not limited

to, School Construction Bonds, Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee (CBOC), Proposition 39, and the California Education Code. He has also filed numerous Freedom of Information Act requests, known in California as CPRA requests with the SFUSD.

Laurance, a graduate of San Francisco public schools K-12, is a small business owner and a licensed general contractor. He helped lead the calls for a return of the SFUSD CBOC after it was not meeting for years. He currently is on the SFUSD CBOC,

He has over two dozen opinion pieces published in 7 local publications, as well as his own newsletter. Laurance recently was a member of the San Francisco Civil Grand Jury. He will soon launch a video podcast on people bringing San Francisco back.



Jack Weir, CABOC Director Emeritus, Co-Founder and Former Chairman



Jack Weir has been a taxpayer advocate for over 40 years. He founded the Pleasant Hill Taxpayers Association in the early 1980s. Later, he became a member of the Contra Costa Taxpayers Association (CoCoTax) serving as president and executive director. He was recognized for his achievements as a taxpayer advocate

and his support of school bond oversight at the May 13, 2023 CABOC board meeting with a resolution.

Advocacy for Citizens Bond Oversight Committees

Jack currently serves on three CBOCs and has served on six Prop 39 CBOCs. For over 20 years he has served on CBOCs, monitoring and reporting to the public on over \$1 billion in school bonds.

He served on the board of directors for the now-defunct California League of Bond Oversight Committees (CaL-BOC). It was started with a primary mission to promote school district accountability by improving the training and resources

available to California's Proposition 39 CBOCs. He then co-founded and served as Chairperson of its successor CABOC.

Jack's experience has shown him that Californians have always supported high-quality public education and have traditionally voted to build and upgrade school facilities. At the end of the last century, however, voter support for school bonds slackened, and school bond ballot measures began to fail the 2/3 approval threshold. Proposition 39 School Bonds lowered the approval threshold to 55%. Prop 39 requires that school districts establish an independent CBOC, whose primary duty is to monitoring school bond program management and report their findings to the public.

Unfortunately, Jack has often experienced significant misuse of school bond funds. These abuses typically occur

in the larger school districts where there may not be close familiarity and communications between residents and district officials as in smaller districts. Residential property owners must pay back bond obligations, usually over a 20-30 year payback period, and frequently at a total of twice the face value of the bonds.

Jack sees that the most serious hurdle to effective bond oversight stems from new CBOC members need to fully understand the critical importance of them being independent and to not subservient to district leaders. CBOC members need proper training and resources to be effective. All too often, the bond ballot language and the initial training of new CBOC members are provided by the bond firms seeking to sell the school bonds. These bond firms' primary responsibility is to their investors, not the taxpayers who will pay for the bonds, or the families whose children will attend the schools and use the facilities constructed with bond funds.

CABOC MISSION

CABOC is the trusted and independent source-of information, education, training, and assistance on school bond oversight to CBOC members and California taxpayers. Proposition 39 (2000) lowered the threshold for local voter approval of school bond measures to 55%. It was accompanied by the mandate to establish independent CBOCs to oversee school bond expenditures and report findings to governing boards, taxpayers, and the general public.

Our mission is to develop the tools: training materials, newsletters, workshops, and conferences to enable CBOC members to engage in rigorous independent oversight and fulfill their obligations to ensure and report that bond money has been spent adequately for the benefit of students, families, their communities and all Californians and to represent our collective interests at the statewide level."




Carolyn Castillo CABOC President

CABOC FOCUS

The implementation of these three Little Hoover Commission* recommendations will guide the focus and work of CABOC:

- "Develop easy-to-access online training materials for members of Citizens' Bond Oversight Committees."
- "The Governor and Legislature should update and overhaul the education code related to the Strict Accountability in Local School Construction Bonds Act of 2000."
- "Impose sanctions for school and community college districts that fail to adhere to constitutional and statutory requirements of Proposition 39, including preventing the district from adopting future bond measures under reduced voter threshold."
- * The Little Hoover Commission (LHC) is a bipartisan, independent California oversight agency to promote the economy and efficiency in state and local government. In their Report #236, February 2017, LHC made recommendations to the Governor and the Legislature regarding School Proposition 39 bonds.




