The El Rancho Unified School District's Story: How One CBOC Member Made a Difference!

Carolyn Castillo CABOC President, former El Rancho USD CBOC and former El Rancho USD School Board Member



Getting involved as a community watchdog on a CBOC changed everything. A school bond is one of community taxpayers' most

significant investments. School bond funds must be used for their intended purposes. As a CBOC member, I learned that poor management resulted in the waste of bond funds. I found problems and brought attention to change the direction of the construction program and helped to get a Fiscal Crisis and Management Assistance Team (FCMAT) fraud audit for the school district's program.

In 2017, the CBOC committee was dissolved by the school board. The following year, I campaigned; was elected and served on the School Board from 2018 until 2022. During 2017–2018 I investigated and performed analysis to conclude in 2018 that there was waste and mismanagement of ER Bond Funds. By mid-2019, a FCMAT audit was initiated and completed, fraud was found due to mismanagement and waste.

At the CABOC Annual conference I will cover details and the lessons learned that helped to get the ERUSD bond program back on the right track.

LESSONS LEARNED

- Benchmark construction cost
- Hire Facilities Manager to oversee bond projects from design, bid and construction
- Competitive bid business, professional services, contracting services over \$50,000
- Prior to awarding a contract to a new contractor, obtain a Dunn & Bradstreet report to learn about the firm's financial stability, age, number of employees and risks
- Bond construction fees should not be based on the percentage of the construction contract
- Ensure a CBOC is in place when construction starts
- Ensure the construction firm possesses the appropriate licenses such as contractors or architectural professional license.
- Be wary of contractors contributing to Political Action Committees or consultants who list PO boxes as their business address
- Ensure superintendents have strong leadership skills coupled with confidence courage to act in the best interest of their school district and community






Carolyn Castillo CABOC President

CABOC FOCUS

The implementation of these three Little Hoover Commission* recommendations will guide the focus and work of CABOC:

■ "Develop easy-to-access online training materials for members of Citizens' Bond Oversight Committees."

■ "The Governor and Legislature should update and overhaul the education code related to the Strict Accountability in Local School Construction Bonds Act of 2000."

■ "Impose sanctions for school and community college districts that fail to adhere to constitutional and statutory requirements of Proposition 39, including preventing the district from adopting future bond measures under reduced voter threshold."

* The Little Hoover Commission (LHC) is a bipartisan, independent California oversight agency to promote the economy and efficiency in state and local government. In their Report #236, February 2017, LHC made recommendations to the Governor and the Legislature regarding School Proposition 39 bonds.
